GUEST SPEAKER: Carl Perry is running for Franklin County Legislature on the Republican ticket. He congratulated the Paul Smith's College students for the upcoming graduation on Sunday, May 13. He is the youngest of 12 children and grew up on a farm. He retired from FCI Ray Brook in 2001 and works part time as a Court Attendant for Franklin County Court helping Judge Main. His wife Rosemary will be retiring from working for the county later this year. They have two grown children who are twins. He will visiting the Town residents during the next few months.

4. TAX COLLECTOR (Amber McKernan):

- a. During the month of April collected \$49,627.53, during May collected \$6,513.10 that was postmarked in April
- b. 2 May issued Check #772 in the amount of \$2.00 as a refund of an overpay.
- c. Friday, May 4, turned books over to the Franklin County Treasurer's Office. Books balanced to the penny. Issued a check #773 to Bryan A. Varin in the amount of \$52,235.06 as the final payment of the warrant for the 2007 tax season. Returned 67 unpaid bills; the County will reimbursement the Town \$134.00 for the \$2.00 second mailing fee on those unpaid bills.
- d. 10 May issued check #774 to Supervisor Peter Martin in the amount of \$1275.27, the final payment of penalties and second mailing fees collected.
- e. Total posted for 2007 is \$1,127,699.56. Collected \$1,099.340.95 of that amount \$2,513.23 were penalties and second mailing fees. Taxes of \$84,066.59 are still outstanding and will be billed and collected by the Franklin County Treasurer's Office.

6. HISTORIAN - Mary Ellen Salls:

- a. Brighton History Day is being planned for two days, Saturday and Sunday, July 7 & 8 at Moody's Farm, (formerly Asplin Tree Farms). Asked if copying and postage for the mailing of Brighton History Day information would be paid for by the Town. The theme is "Town Reunion". There will be a display of old cars and story tellers will be on hand. The Paul Smiths-Gabriels Volunteer Fire Department will set up on Sunday. Lydia Wright will ask if the stage coach can be displayed.

2. PARK & RECREATION - Steve Tucker and Lydia Wright

- b. Inmate crews from Camp Gabriel's cleaned up the needles and broken branches, they did a very good job, the highway department helped remove the debris
- c. Port-a-potty needs to be rented for the summer
- d. Supervisor Peter Martin said the inmate crew's will rebuild the fire pits if the Town purchases the cement and re-bar. Three fire places will be built in the same place as the old ones.

3. INSURANCE/INVESTMENTS - Sheila Delarm and Lydia Wright

- a. Received letter dated May 7, 2007, from NYMIR concerning the payment to the St. Regis Fire Department for their claim. There is a \$50 deductible so the amount of the claim paid for the broken valve by NYMIR is \$411.84. They are waiting for a return letter from the fire department before cutting the check. After the letter is received the Town can pay the \$50 deductible.
- b. Received an endorsement for the insurance policy for updating the addresses of the Town's buildings
- c. Vehicles need to be updated, Highway Department needs to provide information
- d. Bookkeeper is covered by his own insurance, does not need to be added to the Town's insurance

- i. David Knapp received an email dated May 10, 2007 from Cate Blakemore at Crawford and Stearns, the bid packages are not ready yet.
- ii. Received a proposal for overseeing the bid and construction phase of the project to be reviewed by the Board for the June meeting
- b. Furnace at Town Hall: Will contact Griffith to have furnace serviced

OLD BUSINESS

- 1. FIRE ADVISORY BOARD UPDATE (David Knapp): There has not been a meeting since the last board meeting. Next meeting is May 16 to discuss further items of the agreement. Saranac Lake Volunteer Fire Department invited the FAB to their Annual Banquet on Friday, May 18.
 - a. The Village of Saranac Lake adopted a budget of \$623,084 for fire and rescue service. The Town's share of the budget is 5.5% or \$34,270.
 - b. Steve Tucker said the Paul Smith's Gabriels Volunteer Fire Department (PSGVFD) received a bill for dispatch services from the Village of Saranac Lake. Discussion was held on why the PSGVFD would have to pay for this service since there is E-911 service that is paid for through the phone bills with Franklin County. If they only use the Saranac Lake Fire Department (SLVFD) dispatch service, the cost of dispatching is already included in the cost of the Village budget and the Town 's is paying 5.5% of the total cost of the SLVFD not just for rescue services. The PSGVFD should not be paying for a service already paid for by the Town.
- 2. EMERGENCY CALL POLICIES: Board members checked with several organizations to determine what information was available on emergency call policies. Paul Smith's College would like to meet with the fire department to discuss any problems they may be having with emergency calls in early June, the Administration is not aware that there is a problem with emergency alarms.
- 3. ALTERNATE RESCUE SERVICES CITIZENS COMMITTEE (Sheila Delarm): The citizens drafted a request for proposal for rescue services. They would like the Board to review it and see if anyone is interested in providing this service. A Certificate of Need (CON) can be obtained by the Town. If the Town gets a CON the Village of Saranac Lake could drop the Town after the contract expires, the Town would be liable for any service provided by the Town. The neighboring towns are looking at using Tupper Lake for rescue services. Further information will be discussed at the June 14 meeting.
- 4. SIGN FOR OSGOOD POND: David Knapp is waiting to hear from Shawn Reynolds at DEC for requirements for the sign for "Jetskis" on Osgood Pond. The Camp Gabriels Sign Shop will make the sign.

5. TIME WARNER CABLE(TWC):

- a. Supervisor Peter Martin received a copy of a franchise agreement. Need to have a Public Hearing: waiting to hear from TWC to set it up. A copy of the franchise will be distributed to the Board.
- b. Sheila Delarm heard from TWC and they are trying to obtain a cost for installing a line in McColloms. She would like them to provide this as part of the franchise agreement.

CITIZENS COMMENTS:

Mary Ellen Salls: Asked what can be done about the fallen down buildings on State Route 30

Supervisor Peter Martin said she needs to send a written complaint to the Code Enforcement Officer, the Board cannot tell him who to investigate. The District Attorney has to review any cases concerning the Town's local laws if the incident gets that far.

NEW BUSINESS

- 1. JUNKYARD LAW: Supervisor Peter Martin spoke with the Attorney for the Town concerning this local law. Would like to just go with the State Property Maintenance Code. The Attorney advises to keep the current local law and use it. The Code Enforcement Officer should be getting any complaints. Liability might be an issue with the State Law because it covers so much more in detail, such as having only 10 in high grass in the yard. Supervisor Peter Martin would like a more universal law for dealing with this issue where there is no questions about the law. He will contact the District Attorney Office for more information. The State law is available in the Town Hall for review.
- 2. CELL PHONE TOWERS: Supervisor Peter Martin spoke with Steve McFarland concerning a 100 foot cell tower being installed at Paul Smith's College. Steve Tucker said the PSGVFD was contacted about using the land behind the fire house. Cell phone coverage would be to Route 458 in Duane where another tower is being installed.
- 3. DROWNING AT PAUL SMITHS COLLEGE: There were two deaths due to drowning over the weekend at Paul Smiths College. Supervisor Peter Martin asked for a moment of silence in memory of the two men that drowned. He said there could have been more deaths if the students had not acted as quickly as they did to get the rest of the people out of the freezing water. The funerals will held in Vermont. The Town Clerk sent a letter of condolence in the name of the Town to the family with copies of the death certificates. Paul Smith's College was very impressed with the help they received from the Paul Smiths Gabriel's Volunteer Fire Department during this tragedy.
